Viewpoint refers to the mind of the character through which the reader is told a story. There are several kinds of viewpoint, labeled according to the characteristics of the viewpoint itself and the storyteller with whom the viewpoint originates. Objective viewpoint is used when the narrator relates facts but avoids emotion.

As a writer, you must strategically choose the point of view that allows you to most effectively develop your characters and tell your story. First-Person Point of View When the author uses the pronouns "I," "me," "myself," "we," or "mine" to narrate a story, this piece of fiction is using the first-person point of view.

How to Choose the Right Point of View for Your Story

By definition, point of view, also known as POV, relates to two major elements in writing: In the fictional setting of a story, it relates to the narrator, their position and their description of the events and characters. In non-fiction writing, point of view relates to an opinion or the person's insight about a particular subject.

The person telling the story, whose 'voice' we read it in, is called the 'viewpoint character'. In first-person POV, this is the narrator who says 'I'. In second-person point of view, the narrator says 'you'. An example of second-person POV:

The viewpoint character is the guide, sometimes the blind guide, through a scene. The viewpoint character often is, but does not have to be, the protagonist. Due to his focus and concentration on characters and events, the viewpoint character reveals not only what the story is about but who

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it is about.
